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Level: Senior Primary **Duration:** 70 minutes

Topic: Gender Equality – Girl Power

Learning objectives:

By the end of the lesson, students should be able to:

- 1. Identify and summarise the main ideas of the stories watched/read;
- 2. Do an information search and design a poster about a great woman and her achievements;
- 3. Show an in-depth understanding that an individual's ability should not be limited by their gender.

Synopsis:

Susan likes reading about superheroes and dressing up as a superhero. One day she saves a man and extinguishes a fire. She becomes a real superhero in the community.

Moral:

Both girls and boys can contribute to the world by helping the people around them and achieving great things.
