Learning objectives:

By the end of the lesson, students should be able to:

- 1. Read and demonstrate an understanding of the e-book "*Knight Brave and Little Daring*";
- 2. Talk about gender-specific and gender-neutral toys/interests in daily life;
- 3. Show an understanding that one's interests and abilities should not be limited by one's gender.

Story synopsis:

Is bag weaving only for females and sword fighting only for males? This story is about how Little Daring helped Knight Brave and cleverly defeated a huge monster with her woven bag. The story ends with Knight Brave learning to weave bags and Little Daring learning sword fighting.

Moral:

Both girls and boys can be brave and share similar interests. A real wonderland is a genderneutral place, where there is no barrier in the way of people maximising their potential.


